**Footnotes**

MORE THAN A KING pressured the pace shaking clear on the turn, dug in from the three path down the lane finding more late. JERSEY DEVIL tracked evenly through the turn looming a threat from mid track in upper stretch, turned away by MORE THAN A KING late cleared as a willing second best. MARKET BOOM sent hard pressed then chased the pace through the turn, extended in the two path down the stretch would come up short. SEASONAL JOY chased early then dropped off on the turn, held position in the four path down the stretch. BLUESTOOTH was always outrun racing three wide on the turn then angled inside in mid stretch. LITTLE BOPPER dropped back along the inside on the turn. PLEASANT FOX riding the rail was always outrun.
