UNO WAY CALLE broke alert to the early lead, went measured on pace through the turn digging in from the two path in upper stretch, pressured by HYRULE late would hold gamely. HYRULE laid close up shadowing UNO WAY CAFE through the turn, bore down abreast rival pressuring late to no avail. PYGMALION stalked the pace while saving ground through the turn, weakened along the inside down the stretch. WOLFSON was always a step slow angling four wide in upper stretch. HALLIGAN raced evenly in second flight lacking response from mid track down the stretch. DUTY ROSTER struggled racing along the rail steadying briefly when IKE was pulled up inside the eighth pole. IKE was always outrun, took a bad step inside the eighth pole and was pulled up.
