**Footnotes**

REEL PRIME raced four wide entering the first turn, stalked AMERICAN CLASSIC down the backside, bid in tandem with JUST FOR FRANK mid turn, vied in a three way battle running between foes, dropped off a bit turning for home, swung out five wide and came again under strong handling surging up in last jumps for a hard earned victory. JUST FOR FRANK rated early traveling off the rail, made a bold four wide move mid turn, vied running abreast foes at the three eighths, took a slight edge in upper stretch, was under an all out drive coming to the wire but could not hold off REEL PRIME at the wire missing in a hard effort. SCOTTKEITH'SKITTEN was never far off the pace racing along the rail throughout, loomed off of top pair at the quarter pole, remained a threat throughout the stretch run but needed a bit more, settled for third place in a good effort. SALUTING STORMYE unhurried leaving the gate, roused mid turn, angled out five to six wide upper stretch, finished with interest missing a minor award. AMERICAN CLASSIC quickly showed in front, set a rated pace traveling in the two path, headed midway on the second turn, matched strides to the eighth pole, tired in deep stretch in a game try. BONNISTAR settled in the second flight, lacked needed respond when roused, never threatened. NORTH GOAL held a brief tracking position running along the rail, began to fade near the quarter pole. BLUE SOLDIER tracked to the far turn racing four to five wide, gave way in upper stretch. SICCARDI was always outrun in a dull performance.
