Footnotes

BORN TO DISCO stalked early pressing up to grab the lead outside the three sixteenths pole, opened the margin in upper stretch holding firm from the eighth pole in the three path. STYLE IN STILETTOS raced evenly off the pace through the turn, emerged in the four path upper stretch coming on a clear second best. PAWN SHOP QUEEN away slowly was outrun through the turn, rallied in the three path down the stretch improving past the others. EMILY SUN SHINE tracked the pace through the turn then weakened near mid track in upper stretch. NAT'S SAPHIRA a step slow early played no factor. SEAHAG sent clear set the early pace, hooked by BORN TO DISCO approaching the three sixteenths pole would cede to rival giving way along the rail in upper stretch. LOUIMPRESME was always outrun. WALTZING TIME chased the pace through the turn, giving way in upper stretch would swing out six wide late.
