**Footnotes**

SILVER COURAGE unhurried leaving the gate, sat patient to mid turn, angled out near the quarter pole, swung five wide entering the stretch, quickly gained from mid stretch, surged late and arrived in time for the victory. FOXFIRE GIRL raced up close to a contested pace, bid three wide mid turn, took over at the quarter pole, angled to the rail mid stretch, was run down in last jumps, missed in a hard effort. CHANTILLY SLEW hustled from the gate, dueled inside of BILLY'S LITTLELADY to the half, lost the lead at the quarter pole, angled out top of the stretch mounting another bid, loomed throughout the stretch run, needed a bit more late in a game effort. DREAM FLOWER settled in the second flight, rallied three wide in upper stretch, finished willingly. STEPASIDE GIRLS was forwardly placed, tracked down the backside racing in the four path, moved to a menacing position at the quarter pole, failed to sustain bid and flattened out inside the furlong marker. MOJAVE SUNRISE lacked speed and raced towards the rear, mildly responded in the lane but never factored. CRAFTY GIGI raced in mid pack traveling off the rail, roused on the bend, lacked response, no factor. TIMBER GAL was always outrun, offered little. BILLY'S LITTLELADY was hustled going into the first turn, continued on to vie for the lead going to the half, started to fade near the quarter pole, stopped mid stretch finishing weary.
