**Footnotes**

BURN ONE TURN ONE patiently ridden to mid turn, launched rally coming four wide top of the lane, angled a bit in and split foes mid stretch, battled in a three way duel coming to the wire, surged clear late under an all out drive. DESTINED TO SHINE was moved off the rail for the run down the backside, raced in good tracking position to the quarter pole, swung out seven wide upper stretch, was put to strong left handed stick and vied abreast rivals form mid stretch, was out nodded by the winner missing in a very hard effort. HONEST EXPECTATION settled early, gained on the turn running between foes, drew even top of the lane, put a head in front mid stretch, was outfinished by top pair in last jumps and settled for third place. TAXICAB unhurried and trailed to mid turn, swung widest entering the stretch traveling nine wide, gave best action too late improving position. NICE GUY raced up close from the start, bid four wide to vie for the lead at the quarter pole, dueled to mid stretch, shortened stride at the sixteenth pole. ROMAN SUR lacked speed and traveled towards the inside, responded in willingly manner from upper stretch improving placing but was no real threat. GONE PROSPECTING saved ground running in the second flight, gained along the rail entering the stretch, loomed briefly at the furlong marker, leveled off needing more late. TEN BELLS rushed soon after the start to grab a narrow lead, dueled to the quarter pole, began to fade upper stretch, used up. FAST FASHION held a good tracking position to the far turn, put to a drive at the three eighths, lacked response and faded top of the stretch. LONG RANGE MISSILE dueled for the lead to the quarter pole, headed from both sides turning for home, stopped inside the eighth pole finishing spent.
