**Footnotes**

FAIRMONT was a step slow into stride, settled in mid pack and raced along the rail around the turn, angled out to the four path entering the stretch, surged in last jumps to get up on the wire being fully extended. VALIANT HUMOR well placed down the backside, raced a little off the rail stalking a pair of duelers, came three wide moving for the lead past the quarter pole, held a clear advantage with a furlong to go, could not hold off FAIRMONT in last jumps and was nailed on the wire missing in a very hard effort. MIDNIGHT BREAK settled in mid pack, urged coming five wide into the lane, hit best stride late and closed willingly gaining the show position. BOOYA SKEE DADDY rated and traveled in the second flight, raced wide throughout losing ground on the bend, bid six wide upper stretch, leveled off late being outfinished for a minor award. INFIELD was hard used from the gate, set a pressured pace to the quarter pole, began to fade inside the eighth pole, spent. KISS A COYOTE trailed to the quarter pole, angled upper stretch, found best stride too late, finished with interest but never menaced. FULLO SUCCESS vied for the early lead down the backside, began to chase form mid turn, weakened from mid stretch. MITCH'S TWO BELOW tracked down the backside, dropped off some mid turn, lacked response when roused, no factor in the drive. NEIL THE KNIFE raced evenly in the second flight, traveled wide throughout never threatening. SAWTOOTH MOUNTAIN lacked speed racing along the inside, showed little.
