**Footnotes**

SMOOTH TANGO dueled soon after the start running between foes, was smartly taken back to stalk a contested pace, came again entering the stretch running three wide, vied inside the eighth pole under an all out drive, edged clear in deep stretch then prevailed being fully extended. BEARS GENERAL battled from the start racing three wide around the turn, cleared past the quarter pole and was angled to the rail, dug in receiving severe left handed stick, was out nodded missing in a very determined effort. U. S. S. GOLIATH settled in mid pack racing off the rail, rallied six wide top of the lane, surged nearing the wire, game try. SEISMOLOGIST lacked speed trailing to the quarter pole, was taken seven wide in upper stretch, finished strongly missing at the wire. GREGORY'S TRICK unhurried from the gate, came six wide mounting rally in upper stretch, closed willingly. FLYINGPALM raced evenly while saving ground throughout, roused into the lane giving chase, failed to menace. ROLLIN BONEZ settled in the second flight racing between rivals, roused to no avail, never threatened. BORCHETTA raced up close from the start, bid four wide at the quarter pole, loomed to mid stretch, was briefly in tight mid stretch while starting to tire, no late factor. SUMMER SERVICE was hard used from the gate, fought gamely running along the rail, battled to top of the stretch, gave way at the furlong marker, finished spent. FOURTH TOP held a good tracking position to the quarter pole, lacked response when asked for more, gave way in upper stretch.
