WALTZ KING was eased out turning for home then finished determinedly to prevail. HIGH IDEAL well placed, raced greenly during the stretch run then just missed while finishing between rivals. SNOW RIDGE posted the early fractions, drew clear then weakened late. WORTH SPRINGS between foes on the turn, dropped back some, was angled wide nearing the top of the lane then closed some ground late. CAPTAIN'S SECRET raced forwardly placed into the lane and weakened. SHOOBIE was a bit fractious behind the gate, trailed and lacked a solid rally. TAKE ARMS lunged out at the start, raced outside and offered little in the drive. POTOMAC CITY pressed the early issue, ducked in in upper stretch and gave way. TOAST BUSTER was outrun.
