Footnotes

CAPOZZENE rated close to the early pace two deep, assumed a short lead into the backstretch, edged clear toward the quarter pole, drifted slightly outward entering the stretch then widened under steady handling through the final furlong. LEESBURG EXPRESS stumbled at the start, drifted slightly outward into the opening turn, rated close in the three path, edged alongside the winner into the final turn then dueled clear for place while chasing the winner. COSMO QUEEN made light contact with Missy's Advantage into the opening turn, rated close to the lead inside, steadied from her boxed in position nearing the final turn, eased out to start a bid on the turn then finished evenly. BLESS YOU faked out then ducked in at the start, settled into stride toward mid track, angled widest on the final turn for a mild bid and finished evenly. SATURNALIA was carried outward into the first turn, rated off the pace outside, gave chase six wide into the final turn then leveled off through the stretch. MISSY'S ADVANTAGE was brushed into the first turn and never a factor. MARIMBA set the early pace inside, was steadied from contention nearing the final turn, remained a factor to midstretch then tired.
