BIG GEORGE chased the lead on the rail, gained ground steadily, rallied in the upper stretch and closed well to get up in the final strides. SPECIAL PETE drew clear early, weakened in the third turn, faded in the stretch and just failed to last. BIRCH LAKE raced evenly to the outside, gained ground, rallied into the upper stretch and finished evenly. ALFALOONIE lacked speed. saved ground, gained ground in the backstretch and showed a mild rally and finished evenly. CANADIAN KING saved ground, raced evenly, gained ground, rallied in the upper but weakened late. FLYER saved ground, raced evenly and was no factor. THIRDWAY was off slowly, saved ground, showed little. PEPPERCORN raced close up on the rail, gave way steadily and trailed.
