JOYCE G last to leave, sluggish, continued to trail, picked off a couple of tiring rivals after the issue had been decided. HONEYMOON HOTEL broke out but alertly, got clear before a quarter to set the pace, continued to show the way up the backstretch, allowed the winner the rail turning for home, had nothing for that one in the drive, caught late for the place. CHAMP LAILA void of early foot after being bothered at the start, continued behind the winner in the run up the backstretch, followed that rival with and inside advance in the second turn, no match for the winner, up for the place. W W OLMA unhurried in allowing the speed to go early, began a strong bid in the far turn, rail bid turning for home, quickly clear, kept to task. NORTHERN WINN closest to the leader while off the inside, began to weaken in the second turn. ZURI'S GIRL within striking distance in the early going, began to tire after a half. DON'T CHANGE steadily faded.
