FIVE ALARM set the pace off the rail, saved ground into the lane, roused for the drive, held sway late. KINETIC MOTION broke out, forwardly placed along the inside, steadied along the rail into the turn, continued to lack clear room midturn, came off the inside and continued willingly to the end. IFTHESHOFITS forwardly placed while firmly rate in the turn, three wide into stretch, came up empty the final furlong. NO SIREE off the pace while toward the inside asked late in the turn, little response. FOOLISH PROMISE void of early foot, continued to trail into the stretch, improved position by picking off a few tiring foes in the drive. OUR STRAIGHT FLUSH bothered, bobbled at the start, not a threat toward the inside. TAKE THE MONEY was always outrun. PETE'S PRIDE gave way four wide.
