AGREED AFFAIR sped to the early lead, set the pace a bit off the rail, inched away inside on the second turn and drew off under a crack of the whip in midstretch and a brisk hand ride. WARRENS MOONROCKET stalked between horses then outside a rival, was no match for the winner but clearly second best. STORM CRASH between rivals early, stalked along the inside and weakened but bested the others. SUNSET KID settled inside then came off the rail on the backstretch, went around a rival on the second turn, angled out into the stretch and did not rally. SKIMMING'S FIRST stalked three deep then off the rail, angled in and dropped back on the second turn and had little left for the stretch. C R SULTRY SUMMER veered out sharply to break slowly, pulled a bit while well off the rail early, went up four wide leaving the first turn, dropped back outside approaching the second turn, gave way and was eased in the stretch but eventually crossed the wire.
