E. P. BOMBAY dueled outside a rival, inched away and angled in on the backstretch, set the pace inside, drew off under urging in the stretch and won clear. HIGH WAY SIXTY SIX chased inside, came out leaving the turn and again into the stretch and was clearly second best. COOKIE RULES angled in and raced unhurried off the rail early, found the fence on the backstretch, saved ground on the second turn and outfinished a rival for third inside. BUSTANAI settled inside then a bit off the rail, went outside a rival on the backstretch, continued just off the fence on the second turn and into the stretch and was outfinished for the show. A BIG TO'DO chased off the inside, dropped back on the second turn, came out in the stretch and had little left in the drive. GREELY'S GHOST sent along early and dueled inside, stalked a bit off the rail on the backstretch and second turn, dropped back in upper stretch and gave way.
