Footnotes

BLUE JAY ATTACK settled a bit off the rail, came out into the stretch and rallied under a vigorous hand ride and some urging with the whip turned down to gain the lead four wide in deep stretch and proved best. DON PERICO had good early speed and angled in, dueled inside, inched away in the stretch, fought back between foes in deep stretch and held second. HE'S A DANCE STAR broke a bit slowly, pulled his way up inside and was in a bit tight early, saved ground, came out into the stretch, angled inward in midstretch and finished with interest along the rail. DANZING TRIBAL in a bit tight between foes in the chute, chased inside, came out into the stretch, bid between horses in deep stretch and was outfinished. SHU BIZ DANNY angled in and dueled outside a rival, was between foes past the eighth pole and weakened. WARRENS SUMMERGOLD three deep early, settled outside a rival then dropped back off the rail on the backstretch and lacked a further response. SCOTTY JONES broke slowly, settled off the rail, angled in on the turn, came out into the stretch and was outrun.
