ITZA PURRFECT RIDE stalked the pace from along the inside, reached contention on the last turn then dueled through the stretch and prevailed at the wire. FIREHOUSE WILLIE vied for the lead from the two path through the far turn, engaged in a long drive and just missed at the wire. CERTAIN SECRET was unhurried early, raced two wide through the second turn, then made a late bid in the lane. TOM'S TUITION saved ground through the last turn while being outrun to mid stretch, then passed the tired ones. SPINNING OUT was close up early, raced inside through the last turn, then lacked a late response. GRANDMAS PIANO MAN pressed the pace and raced three wide on the second turn then faded late. PESKY EDDIE stalked the pace from the two path to the second turn then flattened out.
