SILVER CRAFT vied for the lead from the two path through the turn, then drew off in mid stretch and just lasted at the wire while under strong urging. VILLAGE ROMEO pressed the pace from the start, raced four wide through the turn, then rallied late and just missed. MISSISSIPPI MAN prompted the pace early, raced five wide on the turn, then gave way late. BLUE NOTION stalked the pace from along the inside through the turn, then weakened in the stretch. RED PETE was close up and three wide on the turn, then lacked a late response. PLAY EIGHTEEN was slow early, saved ground on the turn and was not a threat. YUKON WILDCAT vied for the lead from the start, raced along the inside through the turn, then faded late. HORIZONTAL MICKEY showed brief speed, was through after a half and was outrun.
