MEDAGLIA'S EXPRESS reserved early on the inside, swung out turning for home while collaring the leaders and drew off under a hand ride. HALF A WELL pressed pace early, took command around the turn and could not hold off the winner. PEACEFUL SLEWTION bumped with BUCKLE UP BENJAMIN, settled into stride, raced mid-pack, circled five wide into contention and could not sustain the bid. STORMY PAST raced wide for the first quarter mile, ducked in sharply before the turn while moving to the leaders, and evened out. FIVETHIRTEEN raced wide to the turn, moved up while maintaining an outside path, and lacked a late response. BUCKLE UP BENJAMIN bumped at break, rushed to an early lead and tired . B FOR BEEZ was never a threat. PLATINUM ACE was not a factor.
