Footnotes

COUNTRY LYRIC, forwardly placed four wide under minimal coaxing, moved in hand outside rivals to challenge around the far turn, took over three deep after six furlongs while still within himself, opened up when put to a solid drive in upper stretch then held firm while under strong hand pressure the last sixteenth. KENNESAW MOUNTAIN pulled his way forward between runners then dropped to the rail nearing the backstretch, continued inside to the far turn, shifted out, commenced a run between foes mid way on the final turn, shifted out wider for the drive and gave game chase to the wire. THURMONT vied between foes early, eased back angled out a path leaving the five eighths pole, came back three wide to challenge near the half mile pole, battled inside the winner leaving the five sixteenths pole, held well to mid stretch then faded. SHARK ZAPPER rated back early while saving ground, angled out for the drive and passed tired rivals. TRU GREEK, off the rail, was put to a drive after a half mile, failed to seriously respond and tired through the final three sixteenths. CELTIC WONDER, fractious in the gate, vied three then two wide, led past the five eighths pole, was collared into the far turn, battled to the five sixteenths pole while inside two rivals then tired in upper stretch. GRAY DOWRY vied along the rail for four and a half furlongs then faltered.
