Footnotes

PICCOLO HONEY angled in nearing the half mile marker, advanced along the rail into the lane, angled out, surged clear a furlong out and held sway under a drive. MADAM HERTFIELD , in a bit tight along the inside near the half mile marker, continued inside into the lane, swung out six wide leaving the eighth pole and finished strong. ROSS VALAY , taken to rate, saved ground into the stretch, angled out and finished gamely between rivals. LOV'EMNRUN , fractious in the gate, broke a step slow, came five wide for the drive and finished willingly. AMBER JULE sprinted clear near the half mile marker, set the pace along the inside, was collared in upper stretch then gave way grudgingly in the final seventy yards. RUMBLING GIRL steadied and was in tight soon after the start, raced between rivals near the quarter pole, angled in and came up empty. WEE BURN rushed to contention, chased the pace two wide and weakened leaving the eighth pole. SUNDAY ROAR stalked the pace three wide, dropped back a bit in upper stretch then steadied on heels in mid stretch.
