Footnotes

STORMIN AHEAD took command in the opening strides and set all of the pace from just off the rail, took his longest lead at the furlong pole, shortened stride late but had enough to last. SIBERIAN RUSH tracked the winner three wide throughout then responded in the late stages to be getting to the winner. ONE LUCKY GUY lagged early from the inside and raced unhurried early, had to wait for room from the rail at the quarter pole but responded once room developed in the upper stretch and came on. SHOW OFF settled early from the rail and raced unhurried to the second turn, angled three wide near the quarter pole but lacked the needed closing response. FELLOW ELDERADO was well positioned just off the leaders from the rail into the stretch but did not rally. TWIST MY KAZOO was unhurried early from just off the rail, eased four wide for the second turn but did not rally. STEELY WONDER stalked the pace from the outside for six furlongs and came up empty. CITY CHAPEL was never a factor.
