NORTHERN CAUSEWAY rushed up to set a pressured pace on the inside, kept a short lead to the middle of the stretch, dropped back slightly and then gamely came on again to be up in the final yards. BLUEGRASS REWARD broke alertly, prompted the pace to the eighth pole, assumed a short lead but could not keep the winner a bay late. DUKE OF DOOM lagged on the outside from the start, rallied thee wide on the final turn, staged a mild rally through the lane but did not threaten the top two. MR. CANDY BAR tracked the leaders from the in side to the final turn, shifted out for the drive, showed late interest but could make no headway when it counted. CODY PEAK raced in the middle of the pack to the second turn, bid outside but flattened when the running started. DIAMOND TOUCH tracked from the inside to the final turn, then chased the front ones into the stretch and weakened. ANAKIN was always last.
