Footnotes

MAMOONYA raced off the leaders from between foes, moved up from the inside to engage the leaders nearing the quarter, vied with BEN'S STARRY NIGHT through a hard drive and proved best. BEN'S STARRY NIGHT was never far back while racing along the inside, moved up to gain a slight advantage nearing the quarter, dueled with the winner through the lane but could not match strides with that rival through the final yards. TIZ I IS showed no early speed, raced off the rail into the lane and finished with good energy. DO NO EVIL lacked early speed, saved ground throughout and finished evenly in the drive. MAZAMA broke sharply to duel for the lead from the outside and gave way gradually. TOM BOMBADIL raced off the pacesetters early, moved far outside through the turn and gave way in the drive. EIGHTY EIGHT dueled for the lead from the inside for a half and weakened. EMERALDS BOY dueled for the lead from between rivals for three furlongs and weakened.
