Footnotes

PROMISCUOUS LAD stalked the leaders from the outside, moved up to take command nearing the five-sixteenths pole, opened a clear lead soon after, increased that margin into the lane and held by a diminishing head. FAST CHARLI raced off the leaders from the inside, angled out nearing the quarter and was gaining on the winner late. HAT TURN SIDEWAYS was never far back, raced wide through the second turn and gave way in the drive. RED BALL EXPRESS was fractious in the gate, broke sharply to open a clear margin before going a quarter, saved ground while setting the pace and gave way after going six furlongs. BANDITONTHE LOOSE was off a step slow, lacked early speed, raced wide through the second turn and did not reach contention. PEPPERJACK PETE was away alertly to chase the leaders, appeared hard to rate and weakened after going five-eighths. PERFECT HAND lagged throughout.
