Footnotes

TENPINS pressed the pace racing three wide in front of the stands the first time, took back into a stalking position around the first turn, moved up again to challenge three deep on the backstretch, got the best of his pace rivals entering the second turn but was immediately joined on his outside by both WOODMOON and BOWMAN'S BAND, dueled inside those rivals around the bend, drifted out a bit entering the lane, continued to vie inside the runner up to midstretch before drawing clear late under steady handling. BOWMAN'S BAND was unhurried trailing the field around the first turn, moved a bit closer while racing well in hand and in the five path up the backstretch, made a quick four wide move entering the second turn, dueled three wide around the bend and briefly stuck a head in front approaching the stretch, continued to duel outside of the winner to the final furlong, proved no match late but easily bested the rest. WOODMOON settled off the early pacesetters, moved up quickly while three wide entering the second turn, dueled from between the top pair around the turn, was floated out a bit by the winner entering the stretch and weakened through the drive. PATTON'S VICTORY dueled along the rail to the second turn before tiring. COLORFUL TOUR dueled from the two path to the second turn, tired thereafter. SLIDER settled along the rail early, raced just off the dueling leaders on the backstretch, was shuffled back a bit to trail the compact field entering the second turn, angled out three wide entering the bend, remained within range to the stretch before giving way.
