HABBY QUATORZE settled outside, bid on the final turn, advanced six wide into the stretch then edged clear late. RAIDERS FAN raced off the pace in the two path, rallied near the quarter pole but was outfinished. SILVER CHEST inside early, moved three wide before the half, led in the stretch then weakened. COUNTRY GREEN unruly during the warm-up, prompted the pace to the stretch then faltered. OH MANDIE bobbled briefly at the start, moved inside on the final turn and was no factor. CHERRY LADY set a clear pace to the final turn then gave way in the stretch. WHAT A SMILE was outrun early wide and never a factor. FIRST LADY GLENNA dropped back early and was always outrun.
