JURYS OUT inside early, angled wide before the half, was put to urging on the final turn, responded and was up late after a long drive. MORNING CIGAR settled outside, bid inside on the final turn, led briefly in the stretch but was outfinished. LITTLE ALBERT sprinted clear inside, was challenged near the quarter pole and held on gamely. SUMMA CUM BOOM dropped back outside, continued wide and made a gradual gain. ROB THE BANK pursued the loose pacesetter, vied into the stretch then weakened in the final furlong. NAVY CROSS broke a bit slowly, chased inside and was finished on the final turn. KING CRAB dropped back early and was always outrun.
