IMPERIAL BLUEGRAZZ forced the pace outside, edged to the front at the top of the stretch and pulled away under strong handling. PRIMAL LOVE set a pressured pace off the inside, resisted on the turn but weakened in the stretch. STREET BALLAD stalked three wide off the leaders, was put to urging on the turn then flattened out. MASTER DECEIVER saved ground while close and proved empty in the stretch. SUMMA CUM BOOM lagged far behind then passed fading rivals. AYE JAY POWER raced off the pace very wide and was never a factor. MONEY IN ACTION bobbled at the break and was bumped about, advanced to contention then stopped. FERNANDO SUANCINI dropped back early and was always outrun.
