SPEEDY SWEETY vied for command out from the rail, was clear mid stretch but then was no match late. SWEET SOLITUDE saved ground, steadied on the backstretch, split foes and steadied again on the final. MISSBAUER saved ground and came up empty. ANEARFUL vied for command outside, drifted wider near the stretch and gave way. PRINCE'S PRIZE steadied along in traffic on the backstretch, split foes and took the lead, steadied again near the stretch and gave way. BEST REWARD was wide and never far back, tired. SMOKIN QUEENIE showed nothing.
