Footnotes

HE'S BOY WONDER dueled on the inside, kicked clear leaving the turn and drew off under steady urging. SNICKERS WAY was off slow, raced at the rear of the field, came three wide into the stretch and got up for the place. EARLY BOY was ridden along while off the pace, raced three wide early on the turn then dropped to one off the rail and failed to respond. PACIFIC TSUNAMI was off slow, rushed up to contest the lead, vied three wide on the turn and tired. TM'S YESWECAN dueled for the lead, dropped out near the quarter-pole and gave way. VALID COMMITMENT broke a bit slow, was urged along near the inside, steadied slightly near the three-eighths pole and came up empty. MOJOELAFAVE chased the pace on the outside, vied four wide on the turn and faded. GENUINE TEXAN broke slow then steadied, raced well back in the field and was no factor. MURCIELAGO veered in at the start, recovered and dueled for the lead, dropped back abruptly near the three-eighths pole and was pulled up then vanned off.
