Footnotes

DUBAI FALCON dueled for the lead, made the turn two wide outside a rival, was urged at the quarter pole and kept under steady urging down the stretch. CAJUN DON raced along in midpack and made a slow advance before being put to the whip at the quarter pole, raced along the rail through the turn, altered course under a left-handed whip with an eighth to go and continued his long rally to the wire. MR. TEXAS rated not far behind the top two that dueled for the early lead, was put to the whip nearing the three-eighths pole, ran three wide through the turn and hung in in the final eighth. RIVERSIDES BEST sat comfortably toward the rear of the pack down the backstretch, slowly picked up the pace with three-eighths to go, was three wide in the turn, kept wide in the stretch and passed rivals with a belated rally. MACEDONIAN was under urging not long after leaving the starting gate, was three wide in the turn and made little impact. WALTZ ACROSS TEXAS dueled for the lead and had the rail down the backstretch and through the turn, was asked for run shortly after the quarter pole but tired. STORMY MARKET was pushed along at the half-mile pole, had a two-wide trip and made no threat.
