Footnotes

BURBON ROAD was three wide in the first turn and rated, quickened with three-eighths remaining and was urged to take aim at the lead while four wide at the quarter pole, was under a left-handed whip yet bore in with an eighth left and finally was taken in hand just a few strides from the wire. BETCHO was up to contend the early lead and was bumped slightly from the inside while traveling three wide in the first turn, was two wide in the second turn after ridding the early rival for the lead, was shaken up after leaving the quarter pole and got the left-handed whip a sixteenth of a mile later and determinedly held the place. PACHECO was five wide in the opening turn and kept behind the leaders, advanced steadily following the opening half mile and was in striking distance while about three wide on the final turn, was under the whip before leaving the turn and battled back gamely to eke out a third-place finish. FILET GUMBO was two-wide in the first turn while tracking the early leaders, was kept under a tight grip after the first turn, had an inside trip in the second turn and had little left in the late stages. OTIS HILL was four wide in the opening turn and then veered outward before making it to the backstretch, settled, was two wide in the final turn and showed little after that. WIMBLETON PRINCE was hustled to keep the rail going through the first turn, dueled, tired nearing the quarter pole. UNCLE ROSE broke slowly yet was five wide in the first turn, was no factor. MIDWAY TAP was asked for run and made it inside for a two-wide trip through the opening turn, was in close leaving the first turn but tired after dueling through the backstretch.
