Footnotes

PHARME'S MISSTEAK was allowed to race for the lead on the rail in the first turn, continued on in that fashion down the backstretch while inside a persistent rival, had the rail in the second turn, came under the whip leaving that turn and was passed, fight back gamely under a constant right-handed whip past the eighth pole and maintained a small margin in a game finish to the wire. BONNIE'S CROWN went to the opening turn two wide, came under restraint in the turn, proved to be a handful through the opening half mile, dueled down the backstretch, was two wide in the final turn, took a short lead in midstretch and was determined but outfinished by a game winner to the inside. AMMANNITA broke in away from the starting gate, had a three-wide trip while racing just off the leading pair coming out of the opening turn, called on leaving the three-eighths pole while three wide, finally no match for the top pair. VERUCA SALT raced behind the leaders while four wide in the opening turn, settled back toward midpack down the backstretch, was four wide in the final turn and raced evenly down the stretch. NEW DAWN FAWN was very slow to come out of the starting gate and went three to four wide in the clubhouse turn, came under the whip leaving the three-eighths pole, was six wide in the second turn while commencing a run, no threat. COUSHATA LADY was four wide while stalking in the first turn, made no advance down the backstretch and dropped down to be two wide in the final turn but made no serious bid. NOELANI was two wide in the opening turn while stalking early, tired.
