## **Footnotes**

NAFISS was two wide in the opening turn and came under a strong hold to back off the pace approaching the three-quarter pole, remaining under restraint till the seven-sixteenth marker, advanced and was six wide in the final turn, struck the front at the three-sixteenth marker, came under right-handed urging at the eighth pole and was a driving winner. APRIL EXPECTATIONS was two wide while settling midpack in the first turn, two wide in the second turn while still in midpack, split horses with a sixteenth to go and continued a rally for second. HASHA was swung out to be three wide in the first turn to range up and stalk the leaders from midpack, advanced and was four wide in the second turn but fell short with a rally. DOUBLEUPTOCATCHUP dueled for the early lead and was two wide in the first turn, angled out to be five wide at the quarter pole but was used up and outfinished for the third place. GO FOR DOUGH had to make a five-wide trip through the first turn to press the pace, was two wide in the second turn and tired in the final sixteenth. LENOX LANE was asked early to contest the lead and secure a rail trip through the first turn, continued along the rail through the second turn, was used up and tired in the final eighth of a mile. THUNDER BRITCHES had to travel six wide in the first turn while pressing the pace, was three wide in the second turn and no factor late. FIEND A BIT was three wide in the first turn while well off the pace, still well back while four wide in the second turn and passed a tired horse. FIFTGRADEFIELDTRIP was three wide in the clubhouse turn and dueled for the lead, remained in contention while two wide in the far turn and tired at the five-sixteenth marker.
