Footnotes

JORGE W F stumbled and veered outward coming out of the starting gate, recovered and was allowed to race in midpack, pulled the rider leaving the seven-sixteenth marker to the lead by the quarter pole after circling four wide, was asked for more at the eighth pole and responded. FLASHAHOLIC was allowed to press the pace, led approaching the half-mile pole, challenged with a quarter mile left, had a rail trip, dug in during the stretch and was a game second. CAJUN DON settled in midpack, was four wide after being shaken up at the quarter pole and clearly third at the wire. TOOLBOX was ridden along to pursue the leaders, had a rail trip but tired at the quarter pole. LUKE THE DUKE unhurried, was slow to advance and was caught five wide in the turn and was even in the stretch. TEXAS TRAIN was allowed to duel for the lead, two wide while losing ground in the turn before making no threat. ALWAYS A BLAZE was content to race near the back, was six wide while under the whip at the quarter pole and never threatened. RIVERSIDES BEST was ridden along in midpack and made a steady retreat. SURE PERSONAL was ridden along to pursue the lead, had a rail trip but failed to respond.
