SPARTA MAGIC dueled for the lead inside, remained unasked to the quarter pole while two wide, put under right-handed urging nearing the final eighth, responded and drew clear while being kept to task. BLUEGRASS AFFAIR pressed the pace five wide on the opening turn, reached the leader with three eighths of a mile remaining, drifted a bit to be four wide with a quarter mile left, came under hard urging nearing the eighth pole but failed to go on with the winner. DAFFODIL LADY settled back four wide in the first turn, circled seven wide in the second turn and rallied outside. HONOR LISABETH came out of the gates slowly and settled back three wide in the first turn, three wide in the final turn and loomed into contention under a left-handed whip to the final eighth of a mile but faltered the rest of the way. SILVER SUNDAY was nudged to be behind the early leaders four wide in the first turn, slow to advance and was six wide in the second turn, no threat in the stretch. WITT YOU EXPECT pulled the rider to the first turn and swung out three wide in the opening turn, was kept under a hold by the rider through the opening quarter mile, four wide in the second turn but lacked a response in the stretch. SHEZA PRIZE was shaken up early and went to duel for the lead on the rail, maintained that position but tired with three eighths of a mile to go.
