WEE BE GONE duel on the outside of foe from outset, responded to gain narrow led mid stretch, went gamely under pressure to wire only to be outfinished in a solid effort. WHIRLING CREST hustled to front along rail, set pace into stretch, went gamely under pressure before weakening late. CATABOUT stalked leader into stretch, had no rally. M M EXPRESS forwardly positioned into stretch, lacked response when asked. HOYA failed to menace. GOLDANDSILVER was not a factor. I ALBERT was never a threat. ROCK CHALK was always outrun.
