CANCAN CAKEWALK was allowed to settle early, rallied along the rail slipping thru in the second turn, altered outward at the top of the stretch, wore down his foes and proved best. SUGARBUGA was unhurried early saving ground, angled three wide near the five sixteenth to place a bid, gained a clear advantage into the stretch but failed to last when challenged late. ICED OUT was outrun early six wide down the backstretch, drifted in three wide to sustain a bid at the top of the stretch then went evenly late. POWERFUL PETE was void of early speed, went five wide in the stretch drifting in some and placed a mild effort. YELLOWSTONE (HUN) set the early pace drawing clear racing off the inside and was finished early. OH THREE JACK went three wide, showed little in a dull effort. SILVER CITY JONES stalked the early leader from the outside then gave way.
