Footnotes

CORENN unhurried outside then off the rail, angled in for the turn, came out into the stretch and closed gamely under urging to get up in the late stages. GENERALS PASSION prompted the pace three deep on the backstretch, stalked off the rail then outside a rival on the turn, bid again alongside TIDY STEP into the stretch, brushed that one while taking the lead in upper stretch, could not hold off the winner but saved the place. MARLIZ chased off the rail, split horses into the turn, came out for the stretch and finished with interest. FORCE THE WAY off a bit slowly, settled inside, came out into the stretch and was outfinished. TIDY STEP off a bit slowly, dueled between horses on the backstretch and outside a rival on most of the turn, inched away a bit off the rail a quarter mile out but weakened in the final furlong. ON THE Q TEA was sent inside then taken off the rail and was climbing on the backstretch, went three deep into the turn, came out into the stretch and did not rally. AMAPOLA'S WISH off a bit slowly, was between horses early, dueled inside, began to fall back leaving the turn and weakened.
