**Footnotes**

LUCKY J. H. pulled his way along four wide into the first turn then three deep prompting the pace, took a short lead in upper stretch and gamely prevailed under urging. TOMMY'S TOPPER forced or stalked the pace inside, gained the advantage on the second turn, fought back inside the winner in the stretch and continued willingly to the end. JULIESUGARDADDY angled in and saved ground off the pace, moved up inside on the second turn, came out nearing midstretch and just got the show. NINETY FINE between foes early, also angled in and saved ground chasing the pace, advanced along the rail leaving the second turn, continued inside in the stretch and was edged late for third. GENERALIST four wide into the first turn, chased off the rail, came three deep into the stretch and weakened. PANAMA LANE chased the leaders a bit off the rail then outside a rival on the backstretch and failed to menace. TOP THIS AND THAT had good early speed outside a rival then dueled between horses, dropped back into the stretch and weakened. EMPEROROFOTHERACES angled in entering the first turn, settled outside a rival then off the rail and was not a factor. OLYMPIC MILLER steadied in tight just after the start, pulled his way along five wide into the first turn, moved up four wide into and on the backstretch, dropped back nearing the second turn and gave way.
