Footnotes

ROMAN THREAT a bit awkwardly into stride, went four wide early, stalked three deep then outside a rival, continued off the rail on the turn, bid alongside the runner-up leaving the turn, was fanned five wide into the stretch, gained the advantage under a vigorous hand ride past midstretch and was under steady handling late. SOUTHERN SUNRISE had good early speed and angled in, set the pace off the inside then a bit off the rail, drifted four wide into the stretch, fought back inside the winner but well off the rail, could not match that one late but was clearly second best. RANCHERO had speed inside to stalk the pace, continued along the rail on the turn and in the stretch and held third. NOBLE EXCHANGE broke a bit slowly, chased inside, came out on the turn and three deep into the stretch and put in a late bid at a minor award. RANDAZO between foes early, chased off the rail, went three deep leaving the backstretch, continued off the inside, came out four wide into the stretch and lacked a further response. AN SHANACHIE stalked between horses then a bit off the rail dropped back in the stretch and weakened. ERIC THE RAM chased outside a rival, went between foes a half mile out, dropped back off the rail on the turn and gave way.
