Footnotes

LIVING OUR DREAM pulled between horses early then stalked just off the rail, bid alongside the pacesetter on the second turn to take the lead, inched away while drifting out and being straightened into the stretch and drew clear under some urging and steady handling late. TRIPPED THE LIGHT four wide early, angled in and chased off the rail then inside on the backstretch and second turn, came out into the stretch, split horses in midstretch and was second best. ZIPPIN E had speed three deep then chased off the rail or outside a rival, came three wide into the stretch and bested the others. DEXTERA (GER) sped to the early lead, set the pace inside, fought back along the rail leaving the second turn and weakened in the stretch. POWEROFVOODOO broke out a bit, angled in and saved ground chasing the pace, came out into the stretch and lacked the needed rally. FEED A FEVER settled outside a rival then off the rail chasing the pace, swung out into the stretch and was not a threat.
