Footnotes

KING ROBYN contested the pace from the inside, gained a slim advantage around the bend, shook free when roused nearing midstretch and desperately held under steady right hand urging. TRUCKLE FEATURE forced the pace from between rivals and outside the eventual winner into and around the turn, lost contact with that foe passing the eighth marker but finished willingly and was getting to the leader late. EYE OF THE TIGER reserved while outside foe on the backstretch, saved ground into the lane, angled out passing midstretch and finished stoutly from the outside. INDIAN EXPRESS broke in, settled off the leaders, chased three wide around the turn, angled in some through the drive and produced a mild late rally. ROJO TORO forced the early issue four deep, remained very prominent on a three wide path around the turn and into the stretch but grew weary through the drive and lost placing. ONLY THE BEST was sent up inside to duel early, could not match the leading trio nearing the turn, continued inside and weakened.
