SKIMMING SKIPPER had good early speed outside a rival then inched away and angled into the backstretch, set the pace inside, responded when challenged in the stretch and gamely prevailed under left handed urging. ANGA saved ground chasing the pace, moved up inside on the second turn, came out into the stretch, bid alongside the winner in the drive, reached even terms past the eighth pole but could not get by late. FREE BEER bobbled at the start, chased outside a rival then was in a bit tight into the second turn, angled in nearing the stretch, came a bit off the rail in the drive and gained the show. ZULU KING saved ground stalking the pace, came out into the stretch and was outfinished for third. CALIFORNIA COLONEL sped to the early lead, dueled inside then came off the rail leaving the first turn, stalked on the backstretch, went three deep on the second turn and into the stretch and weakened. BOSTON BAKED BEAN a bit slow to begin, stalked three deep, dropped back on the second turn and also weakened. PEN AND SWORD broke in and bobbled a bit, saved ground off the pace and lacked the needed rally. REGAL FEVER stalked between horses, went three deep into and on the second turn and four wide into the stretch and had little left for the drive. A BIG TO'DO three deep into the first turn, settled off the rail, dropped back on the second turn, drifted inward in the stretch, gave way and was eased.
