DREAM OF SUMMER sped to the early lead, set the pace inside, responded when headed into the stretch, fought back along the rail under urging and gamely prevailed. YEARLY REPORT chased off the rail, moved up four wide then bid three deep on the second turn, took a short lead outside the winner into the stretch, battled outside that one through a long drive and was outgamed. SUMMER WIND DANCER settled outside a rival chasing the pace, moved up inside into the second turn, bid along the rail on that bend, came out into the stretch, could not match the top pair but edged a rival for third. ROYALLY CHOSEN bumped entering the first turn, stalked outside, bid three deep between horses into the second turn, continued outside a foe into the stretch and was edged for the show. BIT OF FOLLY saved ground off the pace, dropped back into and on the second turn and gave way. BARTOK'S BLITHE pulled her way along and bumped a rival into the first turn, stalked off the rail, dropped back between foes on the second turn and had nothing left for the stretch.
