Footnotes

COO CACHOO had good early speed inside then stalked along the rail, was in a bit tight off heels a half mile out, came off the fence leaving the turn and into the stretch, bid alongside the runner-up in midstretch, gained the advantage and drew clear under left handed urging and steady handling late. COURTSIDE sped to the early lead, angled in and set the pace a bit off the rail then inside on the turn and into the stretch, fought back in midstretch, then could not match the winner but held second. MAX COOPER stalked between horses then a bit off the rail, continued inside on the turn, moved up along the rail into the stretch, came out in midstretch and bested the others. SWISS TART broke a bit in the air, tracked the leader four wide then three deep leaving the backstretch and on the turn and into the stretch and weakened. VAUNDELL stalked the pace between foes then off the rail leaving the turn, was between horses again into the stretch and also weakened. DEADLY CATCH between horses early, dropped back a bit off the rail, swung out into the stretch and was not a threat.
