**Footnotes**

CALKINS ROAD angled in and settled a bit off the rail, moved up on the second turn, came out four wide into the stretch and rallied under urging to get up late. CONTINENTAL RED forced out into the first turn, stalked three deep, was in a bit tight leaving the second turn, circled five wide into the stretch and rallied to the front past midstretch, then just failed to hold off the winner. SLIPPERY WHEN BET had speed inside then stalked the pace along the rail, came out into the stretch, bid between horses past the eighth pole and held third. GREY MEMO unhurried outside a rival to the second turn, moved up on that bend, lacked room into the stretch, tried to go between horses in midstretch but was blocked and steadied sharply and could not recover. HOT MARKET reared to be left behind the field, moved up off the rail, chased the leaders, swung six wide into the stretch and lacked the needed late kick. GROOM ON THE RUN saved ground off the pace, advanced inside into the stretch, steadied in tight along the rail in midstretch and could not offer the necessary response. BONUS PAY DAY forced out into the first turn, chased between horses, came three deep into the stretch and weakened in the final furlong. ERIC DA BOMB had good early speed outside a rival, angled in on the lead, set the pace a bit off the rail and also weakened in the final furlong. EARL OF DANBY pulled hard early, drifted out into the first turn, stalked three deep, steadied in tight leaving the second turn gave way.
