Footnotes

GREY MEMO, settled off the pace a bit off the rail, angled out in upper stretch, made the lead past midstretch and pulled clear under urging, then held on. SEVEN JILLION, unhurried outside down the hill, swung five wide into the stretch and closed willingly. GLEEFUL JIG, allowed to settle after cutting the right hand curve, angled in, came out in upper stretch and split rivals with a late bid. KNOXVILLE, vied for command between horses down the hill, took a short lead outside DOUBLE DOLLAR DAY but weakened late. DOUBLE DOLLAR DAY, went up inside to duel for the lead down the hill, gained a short advantage, battled inside until past midstretch, then weakened. INDUCTION DAY, was hustled to the front in the early stages then taken under a hold and dropped back down the hill and passed a pair of tiring rivals in the drive. BULLY'S SOUTH, dueled four wide early then three deep down the hill, dropped back into the stretch and had little left. PRINCE ZACHARY, forced the early pace between horses, was shuffled back after a quarter mile, angled in, saved ground and gave way.
