LOVE THAT RED settled off the rail, angled in leaving the backstretch, slipped through along the fence to bid for the lead into the stretch, gained a short advantage in midstretch, inched away late and gamely held on under urging. STRAIGHT MAN forced the pace three deep down the backstretch, dropped back some into and on the turn, bid again three deep in the final furlong and continued willingly between horses at the wire. CAT THIEF stalked the pace outside on the backstretch and four wide on the turn and into the stretch and finished well outside the top pair. FIVE STAR DAY had good early speed and dueled inside on the backstretch, kicked clear nearing the turn, fought back between foes in the stretch but was outfinished in the late stages. PRIME TIMBER was bumped sideways at the start to be slow into stride, saved ground off the pace, came out in the stretch and lacked the needed rally. DESERT HERO settled off the inside, went four wide into the stretch and could not summon the needed late response PAINTER (ARG) broke in and was bumped soundly to be off slowly, pulled his way along to vie for command between horses on the backstretch, dropped back into and on the turn, gave way and was eased.
